Acceptance	Applicants and their IRCs from the sending institutions will be notified by mid-June at the latest
Health & safety	COVID-19 vaccination: all students must be fully vaccinated before enrolment. Permissible vaccines currently approved in the EU are Comirnaty (BioNTech/Pfizer), Spikevax (Moderna), Vaxzevria (AstraZeneca) and Janssen (Johnson&Johnson). Students are advised to consult their physicians about further recommended vaccinations for Austria, especially FSME/TBE (tick-borne encephalitis).

Practicalities

Insurance	Incoming students must have sufficient insurance covering all risks during their entire stay in Austria. Students from an EU/EEA country or Switzerland who are in possession of valid national health insurance in their home country may apply for a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) with their respective health insurance provider.
Accommodation	No on-campus housing but several furnished student dorms in close vicinity to Bruckneruni. Further information and other housing options will be provided once the student got accepted.
Language courses	Attending a German language course is highly recommended. Successful applicants will receive a list of available German courses in Linz two weeks before the start of their exchange period.
Living expenses	Costs for food, accommodation and basic expenses can be estimated between € 650 and € 800 per month (accommodation: € 200 to 320; food: € 250; plus other expenses for i.e. leisure activities).
